# DIRECTOR'S WELCOME

---

## Hello, Friends of the MJC,

2023 was a year of expansion for the MJC, with new programs and staff joining our foundational services. Look inside to meet several new staff members, learn about the AmeriCorps Courthouse Navigator Program (the first in Wisconsin!), read about our Jon Allen Pacesetter Volunteers for 2023, and to see “by the numbers” who sought help from the MJC. This certainly has been a year to remember.

As we reflect upon our work, we are filled with gratitude for the ongoing support of our founding partners: Milwaukee County Clerk of Court, Milwaukee Bar Association and its Foundation, and Marquette University Law School. We also are glad to be a host site for the Public Allies of Wisconsin program, to collaborate with numerous community agencies hosting the Mobile Legal Clinic, and to welcome volunteers from many different academic institutions in the area

Additionally, to better reflect our work and our place in the field of access to justice, we updated our mission statement and vision statement in 2023.

### **MISSION STATEMENT**

*Through the commitment of our founding partners, the Milwaukee Justice Center is dedicated to providing free civil legal aid at the Milwaukee County Courthouse and in the community via the Mobile Legal Clinic. We endeavor to bridge the justice gap by connecting low-income self-represented people with compassionate and knowledgeable volunteers who champion equitable access to justice.*

### **VISION STATEMENT**

*In envisioning a world where everyone, regardless of socio-economic standing, enjoys equal access to court and legal processes, the Milwaukee Justice Center strives to be a beacon of hope, fostering a society where civil legal aid is not a privilege but a right, ensuring universal access to justice for all.*

Finally, this will be the last Annual Report for which I will serve as Executive Director. I am moving to serve as the Chief Deputy Clerk of Circuit Court beginning mid-March 2024. These past 11 years at the MJC have been the most fulfilling and exciting of my professional life, particularly the years that I served as Executive Director (2015-2024).

In my time in this role, we have been able to do many wonderful things, including:

- expanding the Mobile Legal Clinic program to include two full time clinic supervisors, 2 Public Allies, and the inclusion of both an Estate Planning Clinic and Expungement/Pardon clinic;
- adding new staff in both administrative and programmatic roles to grow from a staff of 4

full-time and 1 part-time to a total of 13 full-time staff (including Public Allies and full-time AmeriCorps members)

- creating numerous remote services to continue helping our Milwaukee neighbors during the pandemic closures, with the new Civil Legal Helpline continuing and expanding in the post-pandemic years;
- developing a dispute resolution program in partnership with Child Support Services;
- originating a civil legal aid game (“Lost in the Law”), with our colleagues at Marquette Law School and Legal Action of Wisconsin, for participants to walk in the shoes of self-represented people in Wisconsin,
- honoring volunteers and supporters of the MJC with annual awards presented at the Run for Justice or other MJC events,
- receiving awards for the Mobile Legal Clinic, Lost in the Law, and creation of remote services,
- being included in research conducted by Georgetown Law School Justice Lab about programs that use non-lawyers to provide services,
- presenting about the MJC in a variety of settings to a variety of audiences, including national webinars, and,
- last but not least—making a personal dream come true through designing and implementing a new AmeriCorps Courthouse Navigator Program to staff a Courthouse information desk and to assist MJC clients with the multi-step filing process.

I am so proud of the many people who have been a part of the MJC Staff over this time and shared their talents to these endeavors and to the service of our Milwaukee neighbors. These amazing men and women have been my most treasured colleagues and friends. I know the current team will continue the tradition of excellence and will take the MJC to new places with renewed vision.

As I say every year and all the time, thank YOU for being an integral part of our efforts to further access to justice in Milwaukee County, whether as partner, donor, volunteer, student, or friend of the MJC. Truly, the MJC and our work could not happen if it were not for the involvement of so many wonderful organizations and people—like you!

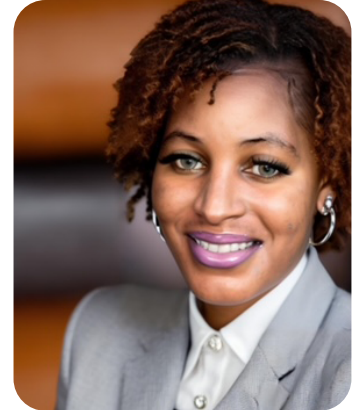


# WELCOME NEW EMPLOYEES

# THE AMERICORPS COURTHOUSE NAVIGATOR PROGRAM

---

In 2023, the Milwaukee Justice Center took a significant step toward enhancing access to justice at the Milwaukee County Courthouse with the introduction of the **AmeriCorps Courthouse Navigator Program**. This initiative was modeled on long-term successful programs running in both Illinois and California and the MJC staff learned much from the staff in these AmeriCorps programs. The implementation of this project is due to the commitment of Milwaukee Justice Center staff, the support of the Milwaukee Bar Association Foundation, a collaboration with Serve Wisconsin, and a dedicated group of new AmeriCorps members.

Operating from October - December 2023, AmeriCorps members assumed dual roles as Navigators—guiding 108 self-representing clients through their document filing process—and as Information Desk personnel—providing crucial information to over 5,200 members of the public entering the Courthouse complex. The program’s impact has been great, alleviating anxiety and frustration for courthouse visitors and garnering expressions of gratitude from various stakeholders, including courthouse employees, attorneys, and judges.

As the program enters the new year, it is poised to grow with the addition of new members and involvement of members in other MJC projects. The success of the program in its inaugural year sets the stage for continued growth, innovation, and positive change in the years to come.



# E-RETURNS FOR PROPERTY TRANSFERS

---

The **Wisconsin Electronic Transfer Return** (eRETR) is a document required by the Register of Deeds office for any transfer of real estate or land. This document is used to inform the State of Wisconsin of all Real Estate/land transfers and if there are any tax exemptions. Clients will receive one on one assistance with completing this form in the Milwaukee Justice Center weekdays on Monday – Wednesday by appointment. Since MJC has begun accepting clients for eRETR assistance, the feedback has been overwhelming: clients are deeply grateful for the assistance after having tried to complete this form on their own and failed. Since other offices no longer provide this assistance, the MJC stepped up to meet a specialized need and have created ease in the lives of many people.



## EVICITION DIVERSION

---

*Meagan Winn, Eviction Diversion Court Coordinator*

The Eviction Diversion project started in 2022 with the support of grant funding from the National Center for State Courts. The goals of the project include preventing avoidable evictions and providing landlords with information and connections to resources to handle their housing challenges.

The program reaches landlords and tenants through the Civil Legal Helpline, the Information Desk, a resource sheet provided to tenants who are being served with an eviction case, and from the court directly. The Eviction Diversion initiative connected with 642 tenants and 63 landlords in 2023.

The program provides litigants general information about the court process so they know what to expect, and offers information for litigants to connect to available legal services, mediation, financial support, and other social services depending on their specific needs.



# FAMILY FORMS CLINIC

The Family Forms Clinic continues to be a bedrock of the Milwaukee Justice Center, serving our Milwaukee neighbors and educating students on access to justice.

In 2023, the MJC served 3,104 clients in the Family Forms Clinic with the help of 110 volunteers.. Of those clients, student volunteers assisted 578 clients with “Part-2” divorce paperwork requiring extensive appointments often lasting 2 hours or more. Additionally, student volunteers regularly assisted clients with filing a divorce (Divorce Part 1), changing or enforcing an existing family court order, and changing the names of adults or minors.

The clinic also experienced personnel changes. In September 2023, Legal Director Kyla Motz, left the MJC after seven years of excellent service to work with the Office of Child Support Services. Because of her important contributions during her tenure, Kyla was inducted into the “MJC Justice League”, a group of non-volunteers who have made a significant impact upon the work of the MJC. We are excited to see what Kyla can do in her new role and how she will continue her excellent work in the court system.

In November 2023, the MJC welcomed a new Legal Director, Emily Boylan, who joined us from Legal Action of Wisconsin. Emily’s her first task was to build the intern team for Spring 2024 and train them for services. Emily has been a fantastic addition to the team and will be a great leader for the MJC in the future.

# CIVIL LEGAL HELPLINE

The Civil Legal Aid Helpline continues to be a vital part of the MJC by connecting members of the public to clinic services. Since its implementation as a result of the pandemic in 2020, the Civil Legal Aid Helpline has remained a high-demand service. In 2023, the helpline was staffed by 39 volunteers and was able to answer 2,764 calls.

Thanks to a Truman Q. McNulty grant from the Wisconsin Law Foundation, the helpline has made significant technological improvements that helped increase access to justice by expanding the number of simultaneous volunteers who can serve and, thus, increased the number calls answered, the number of referrals provided, and the amount of legal information shared. Additionally, these improvements have made calling the helpline more user friendly by creating an automated option for callers to choose to best fit their needs.

# MOBILE LEGAL CLINIC

This team had the dream, desire, and resources to make the Mobile Legal Clinic come alive and continue serving our Milwaukee neighbors for the last 10 years.

Another important partnership for the Mobile Legal Clinic is its relationship with the Milwaukee Public Libraries. In 2023, the Mobile Legal Clinic expanded its presence to serve more than 100 clients at five Milwaukee Public Library locations. .

The relationship between the Mobile Legal Clinic and Milwaukee Public Library began with the former Forest Home Library in 2014. By 2019, the legal clinic had a small presence at three libraries. When the Mobile Legal Clinic returned to in-person services in late 2022, clinic director Marisa Zane recognized the importance of expanding those partnerships. Library staff shared that patrons already use their space to conduct legal research, print and complete court forms, and attend court hearings via Zoom. Partnering with more libraries was the perfect opportunity to meet clients where they are.

Starting with two library host sites in January 2023, the partnership expanded by the end of the year to provide monthly services at five libraries. During that time, librarians began to notice legal clinics at other sites were well-attended, and they wanted to bring those services to their patrons. Because of their support of the Mobile Legal Clinic, Milwaukee Public Library received the Jon Allen Pacesetter Community Member of the Year award at the Milwaukee Justice Center Run for Justice in June.

In 2024, seven public library branches (Atkinson, Capitol, Center Street, East, Mitchell Street, Villard Square, and Washington Park) will serve as legal clinic host sites, in addition to other valued partners and remote services.





# EXPUNGEMENT/ PARDON

In 2023, the Expungement and Pardon Clinic settled into its newer model of services and continued to assist and empower Milwaukee County residents and other Wisconsinites who are seeking a pardon or expungement of a criminal conviction. Clients and volunteers alike seem to value the breakdown of clinic services into two distinct parts: In “Part A,” volunteers assist clients to determine eligibility for a pardon or expungement, and in “Part B,” clients eligible for a pardon work with volunteers to complete the extensive pardon application, prepare documents for submission, and review what can happen in a pardon board hearing.

While the clinic primarily operates remotely on Zoom, it acknowledges the barriers that prevent some people from consistently or effectively using technology, and has continued its efforts to provide in-person services where needed. This year, the Expungement/Pardon team attended regular community events with the Mobile Legal Clinic and made accommodations to welcome several clients to the MJC’s space at the courthouse for assistance with the pardon application.

The clinic’s senior attorney supervisor, Natalie Lewandowski, welcomed her first child in late 2023. While this presented a challenge in terms of supervising and managing the semester’s remaining clinics, clinic staff and volunteer attorneys came together to ensure the clinic could run at the same capacity as before. This would not have been possible without the help of clinic supervisor/coordinator Dakota Loos-Wallace, who returned for his second year with the AmeriCorps Public Allies program and who handled this transition with grace and aplomb. Atty. Lewandowski is excited to return to her work supervising the Expungement and Pardon Clinic in 2024!

## BY THE NUMBERS

At least **48 pardon applicants** who have worked with the Expungement/Pardon Clinic since 2019 have successfully received pardons from Governor Evers.

**19** of those people were pardoned in 2023.

**40** of those people are residents of Milwaukee County.

At least **28** of those people were under age 25 at the time they became felons.

In 2023, the MLC’s Expungement/ Pardon Clinic provided over **170 clients free services** related to their options for post-conviction criminal record relief. This number is substantially higher than last year.

In 2023, the clinic provided over **114 pardon-eligible clients** with extensive assistance on the pardon application process. This is almost double the number of clients we assisted in 2022!



# RUN FOR JUSTICE 2023

**The 12th Annual Run for Justice was another great success raising \$32,902.25** to support the work of the MJC! Joined by the Milwaukee legal community, family, and friends, 381 participants were able to enjoy a perfectly warm lakefront evening. To add to the fun, the one and only Bernie Brewer made an appearance and took pictures with fans. In addition to an annual donation of adult beverages from Enlightened Brewery, other post-race food and refreshments were provided by local food trucks, Kona Ice and Rose Mob Grill. In an annual tradition, the Milwaukee Justice Center recognized many of its outstanding volunteers at the post-race ceremony. This year, the Jon Allen Pacesetter Awards, recognizing those who 'set the pace' for volunteer service, honored:

This year the MJC introduced a brand new recognition at the Run for Justice: the Michael J. Skwierawski Champion of Justice award. Named after Judge Skwierawski (one of the Milwaukee Justice Center founders and ongoing supporters), this award recognizes outstanding members of the legal community that have dedicated their life's work to Civil Legal Aid and improving access to justice. The inaugural Champion of Justice recognized at this year's event was Attorney Jeff Brown who spent almost 20 years leading the Legal Services Committee for the State Bar of Wisconsin and as a member of the Wisconsin Access to Justice Commission.. Under Jeff's leadership, significant expansions of service, partnerships, and new initiatives were developed. Prior to the Run, Jeff moved to serve as a grant manager with the Wisconsin Trust Account Foundation. His influence on access to justice in Wisconsin will be long-lasting.
